BEYOND THE FRAME: A Systematic Mapping Experience




On Saturday, September 13th, the gallery became a host for a unique collective experience: a systematic mapping session where sculptures and participants came together in a shared act of reflection.

An unforgettable journey of discovery, feeling, and reflection.







Inauguración: 9 de octubre Exposición: 9 de octubre – 31 de octubre Antonio Luquín was born in Guadalajara, Jalisco, in 1959, and moved to Mexico City in 1964. After briefly studying architecture, he pursued a degree in Art History, a foundation that would shape the intellectual and visual depth of his work. In the early 1980s he painted murals, experimented with film, and worked as a researcher at the Instituto Nacional de Bellas Artes, also writing for Uno + Uno. By 1990, he left his institutional role to dedicate himself fully to painting.

Since his first solo exhibition in 1991, Luquín has presented his work in some of Mexico's most important cultural spaces, including the Museo Universitario del Chopo, Arte Actual Mexicano, and Praxis Gallery, while also exhibiting internationally in the United States and Europe. His participation in key biennials—such as Monterrey and Rufino Tamayo—alongside numerous collective projects, has consolidated his presence in the contemporary art scene.

Dark, meticulous, and hauntingly evocative, Luquín's canvases invite us not only to look but to endure their presence. His art confronts us with faces, silences, and spaces that extend beyond the frame, transforming each work into a fragment of a universe both familiar and strange.
